Several practical strategies will be provided including several relating to communication and social skill development (e.g., gaze avoidance, content-connected materials, teaching to strengths and special interests (e.g., rolodex reader, DIY ABC book), and movement. This session is specifically focused on rethinking - rethinking inclusion, rethinking autism, and rethinking possibilities for all students.

LEARNER OBJECTIVES:

1. Explain autism from the "inside out".
2. Describe language as a tool for support.
3. Illustrate 3 reasons to reject the deficit model of autism.
4. Discover a range of ways to support social and communication goals in the context of standards-based instruction.
5. Investigate how student fascinations (e.g., trains, elevators) and strengths can be used to teach, calm, comfort and inspire.
6. Examine the benefits of offering student-centered support & listening to learners on the spectrum.
